



## TOWN OF KURE BEACH

### **DECLARATION OF STATE OF EMERGENCY**


**WHEREAS**, North Carolina Governor Cooper and the Governing Body of New Hanover County have both determined that a State of Emergency, as defined in General Statute 14-288 and a state of Threatened Disaster as defined in General Statute 166A-4 exists, due to the approach and proximity of Hurricane Florence; and

**WHEREAS**, the current forecast condition for Hurricane Florence will impact Kure Beach with significant rain, gusting high winds, strong storm surge and flooding;

**NOW, THEREFORE**, the Kure Beach Town Council does hereby declare a State of Emergency and Threatened Disaster in the Town of Kure Beach and orders the following:

- Mandatory evacuation effective 8 am Tuesday, September 11, 2018 to be completed by 8 pm on Wednesday, September 12, 2018
- Curfew is expected to be enacted as required and will be communicated with at least twelve hours' notice
- No Sale of Alcoholic Beverages expected to be enacted as required and will be communicated with at least 12 hours' notice
- Shelters to be provided by county
- Town offices serving the public will close at 3 pm on Tuesday, September 11, 2018 until the State of Emergency is lifted
- Town emergency essential personnel to remain on duty and available during the duration of the State of Emergency
- Execution of Town of Kure Beach Emergency Operations Plan is effective immediately with all persons, businesses and emergency management personnel within the Town limits ordered to comply with the plan
- All Kure Beach officials are to cooperate in the implementation of the provisions of this Declaration

Declared this 10<sup>th</sup> day of September, 2018 retroactive to 11 am this day.
