• Bernard Robinson & Co., Victor Blackburn, presentation of FY 2019-2020 audit Mr. Blackburn reviewed highlight of the FY 2019-2020 audit as referenced in attached presentation, herein incorporated as part of these minutes.

DISCUSSION AND CONSIDERATION OF COMMITTEE BUSINESS

- 1. Bike/Ped Committee
 - Bike Ped Committee Update and Presentation

Chairman Linquist gave a presentation on the East Coast Greenway, herein incorporated as part of these minutes.

Commissioner Oliver stated he supports the Committees recommendation regarding joining the East Coast Greenway system. The cost has already been budgeted for the signs. If Town Council has any questions Town Council can email Chairman Linquist and the Committee will review the questions and bring back answers to the December Council meeting.

Mayor Bloszinsky stated he is highly favorable but would like to continue the discussion to next month's meeting after having time for Town Council to review the routes of the system.

Commissioner Ellen stated he supports the Committees recommendation.

Commissioner Whitley stated he supports the Committees recommendation.

MPT Heglar commented he suggests Town Council have a Public Hearing regarding the route so citizens input can be reviewed. The Town may want to consider multiple routes on the map the same way Carolina Beach has different routes. He is support of the Committees recommendation.

Town Clerk Sanders to send out Town News email to receive citizens input on the East Coast Greenway System.

2. Land Use Plan Committee

Commissioner Whitley commented the Committee did meet and Planning & Zoning will be reviewing the Land Use Plan to give feedback. The Council of Government will attend the December meeting to give Town Council a detailed review of what could be provided for rewriting the Land Use Plan.

3. Parking Committee

Mayor Bloszinsky stated the Parking Committee has received 6 parking proposals and the recommendation from the Committee will be on the Town Council January agenda.

4. Shoreline Access and Beach Protection

Commissioner Whitley stated the SLABP Committee will be walking the beach and are currently working on creating a standard of which signs should be on the beach strand at each beach access.

5. Stormwater Oversight Committee

MPT Heglar stated the Committee will meet next Monday night and is currently waiting on the State to return the Towns proposal for the audit issues. Once received hopefully in January there will be ordinance changes needed.

DISCUSSION AND CONSIDERATION OF DEPARTMENT HEAD BUSINESS

1. Administration

Town Clerk Sanders stated working with LDSI for the BRIC grant due by the end of December. The Town was accepted to apply for the grant after receiving the letter of intent. LSDI is requesting additional information before determining the cost of writing the grant. Once she receives more information, she will bring information regarding the cost to the December Town Council meeting.

MPT Heglar stated Town Clerk Sanders may need to pull Town Council regarding the funding of working with LDSI on the grant for the Town.

2. Fire Department

Fire Chief Kennedy stated he has updated the monthly report to be more transparent to Town Council and Citizens. The Fire Department planned to host a gathering of 25 people this coming Thursday in the bay area with doors open to honor a member of the Fire Department. In the FAQ portion there is an exclusion for gatherings for work. Social distancing requirements would be followed, and masks required. Tables would be separated, and food would be served to each table.

MPT Heglar stated he is supportive of the event. The bay area with fans is an outdoor space and the members already interact on emergency calls.

Commissioner Ellen stated the Governor gives another update in December so may want to wait to see if he increases the gathering size. He thinks Town Council should all attend the event.

Commissioner Whitley stated he supports the event.

Commissioner Oliver stated he is supportive but suggest seating the members of the event by shift.

3. Recreation Department

Recreation Keely stated:

1. Continued Discussion Garbage at Rental Properties throughout Town

Mayor Bloszinsky stated the Town had 19 violations in Town this past month. The Town Council may want to discuss further next year.

Building Inspector Batson stated citizens currently first receive a sticker on the cart for the first violation and for the second violation the citizen receives a letter before receiving a citation.

1. Speed Limit

- Adoption of an ordinance repealing the 25 mph on US 421 (Fort Fisher Boulevard) between H Avenue (non-system) and N Avenue (non-system)
- Adoption of an ordinance declaring a 25 mph on US 421 (Fort Fisher Boulevard) between H Avenue (non-system) and Alabama Avenue (non-system) at the common Kure Beach – Carolina Beach municipal limits
- Adoption of Proposed text amendment to Chapter 10 (Motor Vehicles and Traffic) Article 06 (Operation of Vehicles) Section 020 (Speed Limits)

Attorney Eldridge stated:

- 421 Fort Fisher BLVD is a State Highway that requires a speed study to change the speed limit and this study has been completed
- Town Council needs to repeal and declare the old and new speed limit
- NCDOT on their agenda to adopt concurring ordinances repealing and declaring
- Town Council does not need to adopt an ordinance repealing the 35mph as it is established by General Statute
- All changes will be effective once NCDOT adopts concurring ordinance and signs are installed
- Proposed text amendment changes the current provision in the code to delete the 35mph speed limit

2. Discussion of Re-Entry Decal Mailing Process

Finance Officer Copenhaver commented the Town Staff has determined the water bills will not need to be included in the Re-Entry Decal mailing packet this year. This will save the Town postage cost and a lot of Town staff labor costs.

Commissioner Oliver gave a presentation on the Port, Waterway and Beach Commission herein, incorporated into the minutes.

MPT Heglar stated the Town has received a quote from LDSI for behind Settlers Lane regarding surveying. Does Town Council want to proceed with the surveying? MOTSU stated in a discussion that they were supportive of it.

Commissioner Whitley stated yes, the Town needs to proceed.






TOWN OF KURE BEACH TOTAL NET POSITION



TOWN OF KURE BEACH GOVERNMENTAL ACTIVITIES NET POSITION




TOWN OF KURE BEACH BUSINESS-TYPE ACTIVITIES NET POSITION
