#### Dear Mayor Craig Bloszinsky,

We addressed the town council on 4/19/18 regarding the building of a swimming pool. We supplied a survey showing the footprint, which at that time we projected at a little over 27 feet. At that same meeting we executed an Encroachment Agreement with the town of Kure Beach. We hired an engineer and was making progress on our pool until hurricane Florence arrived. We went back to our engineer, surveyor and pool designer at the beginning of this year and when they laid out the pool we realized that we did not allow for the one foot of coping that has to go all around the pool. We are asking to amend the agreement to allow the two feet of coping needed. The footprint we are now asking for would encroach by approximately a little over 29 feet. As you may recall, prior to the approval of our pool, the previous swimming pool approved by the town council encroached by 35 feet. We would like to address the town council during the open agenda portion of its meeting on 1/28/19.

### **ENCROACHMENT AGREEMENT**

This Agreement, entered into this  $\frac{\checkmark}{}$  day of  $\frac{}{}$  day of  $\frac{}{}$  , 2018, by and between the TOWN OF KURE BEACH, NORTH CAROLINA, a North Carolina municipal corporation, having an address of 117 Settlers Lane, Kure Beach, NC 28449 (hereinafter "Grantor") and ANTHONY J. KARBOSKI and wife, CONNIE MEARKLE, citizens and residents of Potomac, Maryland, hereinafter referred to as "Grantee".

#### WITNESSETH

WHEREAS, by virtue of that General Warranty Deed recorded in Book 5031 at page 2335 of the New Hanover County Registry, Grantee is the owner of that certain property known as Lot 13, Kure Dunes, Phase 1 as shown on that map recorded in Map Book 29, Page 126 of the New Hanover County Registry ("Subject Property"); and

WHEREAS, by virtue of an instrument entitled Perpetual Easement for Beach Renourishment recorded on December 11, 1995 in Book 1962 at Page 558of the New Hanover County, Grantee's predecessor in title granted a beach renourishment easement ("Easement") over and across the eastern portion of the Subject Property ("Easement Area"), as more fully set forth in said instrument;

WHEREAS, Grantee desires to encroach upon the Easement Area for the purposes of constructing a swimming pool and accompanying deck, said improvements being more particularly shown on the attached drawings marked Exhibit "A" (consisting of two pages) which drawings are incorporated herein by reference; and

WHEREAS, it is to the material advantage of Grantee to effect this encroachment and Grantees have represented that such use will not substantially impair or hinder Grantor's use or administration of the Easement within the Easement area; and

NOW, THERFORE, IT IS AGREED, that Grantor hereby grants to Grantee the right and privilege to make this encroachment, subject to the following:


- The permitted encroachment shall be, as follows:
- a. Grantee shall be permitted to construct a swimming pool and accompanying deck that complies with the provisions of the ordinances of the Town of Kure Beach within the Easement Area on the location shown on Exhibit "A".
- b. Grantee shall be permitted to maintain the swimming pool and accompanying deck at the location as shown on Exhibit "A";
- c. In no event shall any portion of Grantee's swimming pool and accompanying deck to which this Agreement applies be expanded or enlarged without the express written permission from Grantor; and
- d. In the event of damage or destruction of the swimming pool and accompanying deck within the Easement Area due to storm or other occurrence, the permitted encroachment may not be replaced or repaired without the express written permission from Grantor and any reconstruction of the deck and/or swimming pool must be in compliance with all applicable ordinances of the Town of Kure Beach; provided, however, that normal maintenance of the encroaching swimming pool and accompanying deck shall be permitted.
- 2. The design, construction and installation of the swimming pool and accompanying deck within the Easement Area shall not be undertaken without prior written approval from the Building Inspector for the Town of Kure Beach or his/her designated representatives.
- 3. Grantee shall design, construct, install, operate, maintain and use the encroaching facilities in a safe and property manner and shall maintain the facilities in a safe and proper condition at all times.
- 4. Grantor may at any time and for any reason require the removal, repair, alteration or change in the location and/or design of the swimming pool and accompanying deck within the Easement Area and the elimination of the encroachment. In the event that Grantor requires the removal, repair, alteration or change in the location and/or design of the encroachment, Grantee shall remove, repair, alter and/or replace the encroachment within thirty (30) days without any cost to the Grantor. In the


event that Grantee fails to remove, repair, alter and/or replace the encroachment within thirty (30) days of Grantee's receipt of notice from the Grantor, then (a) Grantor shall have the right to immediately remove, repair, alter and/or replace the encroachment, and (b) Grantee shall reimburse Grantor for the full costs of removing, repairing, altering and/or replacing the encroachment. If Grantee fails to reimburse Grantor in full within thirty (30) days of Grantee's receipt of an invoice from Grantor for such work performed by Grantor as described above, then Grantor shall have the right to file a lien with the Office of the Clerk of Court of Superior Court for New Hanover County upon Grantee's Subject Property in favor of Grantor in an amount equal to the full costs of removing, repairing, altering and/or replacing the encroachment.

- 5. To the fullest extent permitted by law, Grantee shall release Grantor, its agents, officials and employees from any and all responsibility or liability for claims, damage or injury of any kind or nature to all officials or employees of Grantor, and to all property proximately caused by, incident to, resulting from, arising out of, or occurring in connection with, the design construction, installation, maintenance or use by Grantees of the encroaching facilities within the Easement Area described herein.
- 6. Grantee agrees to restore all areas disturbed by the construction, installation, operation, maintenance and use of this encroachment to a condition satisfactory to the Building Inspector for the Town of Kure Beach and to all property proximately caused by, incident to, resulting from, arising out of, or occurring in connection with, the design, construction, installation, maintenance or use by Grantee of the encroaching facilities within the Easement Area described herein.
- 7. Grantee agrees to obtain all necessary permits and pay any associated permit fees.
- 8. Grantee agrees to have available at the construction site, at all times during construction, copies of the required permits and a copy of this Agreement evidencing approval by Grantor.
- 9. In the case of noncompliance with any term of this Agreement by Grantee, Grantor reserves the right to stop all work until the facility has either been brought into compliance or been removed from the Easement Area.
- 10. This Agreement runs with the land and any obligation of Grantee under this Agreement shall be binding upon Grantee's heirs, successors, agents, officials, employees, independent contractors and subcontractors in the event of nonperformance, regardless of cause.
- 11. Grantee will comply with any applicable federal, state and local standards, regulations, laws, statutes, ordinances and zoning, subdivision or other land use regulations.

- 12. No paid employee of Grantor shall have a personal or financial interest, direct or indirect, as a contracting party or otherwise, in the performance of work for Grantee.
- 13. The Grantor's failure to insist upon strict performance of any provision of this Agreement, or to exercise any right based upon a beach thereof, or the acceptance of any performance during such breach, shall not constitute a waiver of any rights under this Agreement.
- 14. All of the terms and conditions contained herein shall be interpreted in accordance with the laws of the State of North Carolina. In the event of a conflict between the various terms and conditions contained herein or between these terms and other applicable provisions, then the more particular shall prevail over the general and the more stringent or higher standard shall prevail over the less stringent or lower standard.
  - 15. This Agreement constitutes the entire understanding of the parties.
- 16. The parties will make and execute all further instruments and documents required to carry out the purposes and intent of this Agreement.
- 17. If any section, subsection, paragraph, sentence, clause, phrase or portion of this Agreement is for any reason held invalid, unlawful or unconstitutional by any court of competent jurisdiction, such portion shall be deemed severable and such holding shall not affect the validity of the remaining portions thereof.
- 18. This Agreement shall not be modified or otherwise amended except in writing signed by the parties.
- 19. The designation, Grantee and Grantor as used herein shall include the singular, plural, masculine, feminine or neuter as required by context.
- 20. This Agreement applied only to Grantee's construction of a swimming pool and accompanying deck within the Easement Area and does not in any way limit, impair, or impede Grantee's rights to construct, maintain and/or repair current or future buildings, structures, and other improvements on the Subject Property in accordance with all applicable ordinances of the Town of Kure Beach.

Your Naming Committee has followed the process under Article 4 Facilities, Section 4.03 Naming Public Facilities adopted 06/16/2009 to consider naming the new Fire Dept. Structure in the Town Complex. It is not the intent of this committee to name all buildings but this new structure is a unique opportunity to honor people whose voluntary service is extraordinary in both tenure and selflessness.

This committee did pursue input from other Town Committees for naming this facility and there were no other recommendations. Therefore the Naming Committee submits the name of HEGLAR STATION for due consideration for the new Kure Beach Fire Dept. Building.

There have been many volunteers for our Fire Dept. over the years and the service of our town fathers is duly noted in the name of our Town. Beyond these respected families are many contributors but none have contributed at the levels of the last three generations of the Heglar family.

Fire Dept. Service

Harold Heglar, 45 years service, 42 as Chief. Official leader of the Fire Dept. growth till last year.

Jerry Heglar, 45 years of volunteer service as fire fighter.

David Heglar, 22 years of volunteer service as fire fighter, 20 years voluntary service as Emergency Manager.

These three men provided 132 years of service to the fire dept. More than a century of volunteer work with only 13 of these years at a reasonable salary for Fire Chief.

This tally is not complete as it does not cover the service on Town Council for David or his Grandfather Dub. It does not include the Dub's service as Police Chief or Public Works Director. It does not include Michael's service as Lifeguard or Public Works employee. It does not cover the support of the Heglar Women to their men and the town. These men walked into buildings on fire, took small boats into the fog to rescue errant boaters and distressed swimmers. They accepted the mental burden of managing hurricane recoveries, leaving home, family and any activities at any time of day or night when others need help. I have no idea how to measure that. Therefore the Naming Committee submits the name Heglar Station in recognition of the incredible service of this family to this town.

Our next step is to put this information out for 30 days for public comment if Council agrees.

### Background

Before the renovation/expansion project began, a bronze dedication plaque hung on the outside wall of Town Hall from when the building was constructed in 1991.

This plaque stills applies since some of the original Town Hall is in place and Council needs to decide whether to use this plaque at the renovated/expanded Town Hall. Additionally, there is no outside wall space to hang this plaque as it is mostly window space now.

Council also needs to decide if there will be a dedication plaque for the renovation/expansion project for Town Hall that will include the renovation/expansion of the Police Department and construction of the new Fire Station, or whether there will be a similar plaque at each of those buildings, or no dedication plaque at all.

If there will be dedication plaques, a suggestion is to use a pedestal type sign such as those at the Ocean Front Park and place these in the landscaping in front of Town Hall and /or the other buildings.

### **REVIEW OF COMMITTEE POLICY**

Article III, Section 42, Subsections
Chap 2, Art. III, Section 42 on P&Z  Subsection b - The members of the commission may, after a public hearing, be removed by the appointing authority for inefficiency, neglect of duty or malfeasance in office.  Subsection d - Faithful attendance at the meetings of the commission is considered a prerequisite for the maintenance of membership on the commission.  Chap 19, Section 45 on BOA  Members of the Board of Adjustment may, after a public hearing, be removed by the appointing authority for inefficiency, neglect of duty or malfeasance in office Faithful attendance of the meetings of the board is considered a prerequisite for the maintenance of membership on the
1

- 2. No person may be appointed to serve on, or in any way be associated with, any committee if that person has an unpaid financial obligation to the Town.
  - a. Such obligations include past due taxes, water and sewer and related fees more than 60 days in arrears and unpaid citations, unless under contest or other obligations as may be determined by the Town.
  - b. A full-time resident or property owner becomes eligible to serve upon certification by the Town Finance Officer or Town Clerk that all financial obligations to the Town of Kure Beach have been satisfied.
- 3. No person may be appointed to, or serve on, any committee except upon submittal of proper application and appointment by a vote of the Kure Beach Town Council.
- 4. Each committee of the Town is requested to prepare and submit to Town Council a list of minimum requirements for committee membership. The Town Clerk will maintain such lists as approved by the Council. Each committee may update the requirements periodically as needed. (Exemption –Marketing Committee)
- 5. Requirements of this section notwithstanding, any person serving on an appointed committee and or board at the time this policy is adopted, may serve out the term of appointment.
- 6. No person may serve upon more than three committees at one time nor serve as chairperson of more than one committee.

#### C. AD HOC COMMITTEE TERMS AND VACANCIES

- 1. All committee appointees for ad hoc committees have no set term limits.
- 2. Committee members are required to attend all regularly scheduled committee meetings unless excused by the committee chair or a vote of the committee. Three unexcused absences shall be deemed a resignation from the committee and reported as such to the Kure Beach Town Council. Vacancies resulting from such absences shall be filled according to the procedure listed below.
- 3. The chair of each committee shall report all committee vacancies to the Town Clerk who is hereby authorized to advertise for volunteers to submit applications to serve on Town committees.

3. Vacancies for both shall be advertised by the Town Clerk.

Planning and Zoning Commission (P&Z) applicants:

Applications received by the Town Clerk will be forwarded to the P&Z clerk and chairperson to schedule interviews and include on the agenda. P&Z will interview applicants and make a recommendation to Town Council. The Council will make the official appointment.

Board of Adjustment (BOA) applicants

Applications received by the Town Clerk will be scheduled for interview by the Town Clerk in a Council meeting. The Town Council will make the official appointment.

- 4. All applications shall be retained for a period of one (1) year.
- 5. Members, after a public hearing, may be removed by the Town Council for inefficiency, neglect of duty or malfeasance in office.
- 6. Faithful attendance of the meetings is considered a prerequisite for the maintenance of membership.
- 7. All members have equal voting on all matters that come before them.
- 8. Members shall elect a chairman to serve a one-year term or until a successor is elected and shall be eligible for re-election.
- 9. There shall be a quorum of three members for the purpose of taking any official action required by this article.

Sec. 19-44. - Chairman; term; duties.

- (a) The chairman of the board of adjustment shall be elected by the full membership including alternate and extraterritorial members of the board of adjustment from among its regular members.

- (c) The chairman shall decide upon all points of order and procedure unless directed otherwise by a majority of the board in session at the time.

3. All committees, boards and commissions of the Town of Kure Beach will conduct regularly scheduled meetings, open to the public, with meeting records and minutes taken. (Exemption – Damage Assessment and Emergency Operations.)

#### H. DAMAGE ASSESSMENT AND EMERGENCY OPERATIONS COMMITTEES

The Town Council has two committees established for emergency management situations only. These committees do not hold regularly scheduled meetings and serve only during potential emergency situations to either represent the Town at the County Emergency Operations Center or to assist the Building Inspector and department heads in damage assessment after an emergency.

The only part of this policy applicable for these two committees is the following:

Vacancies for both shall be advertised by the Clerk. Applications received by the clerk will be forwarded to Town Council members for review. All applications shall be retained for a period of one (1) year. Town Council members will interview applicants at a properly scheduled meeting of the Council in open session. Town Council will, by vote of the Council, approve one applicant for each position. Incumbent members do not interview applicants, only Town Council.

#### I. COMMISSIONS AND BOARDS REQUIRED BY N.C. GENERAL STATUTE

Commissions and Boards covered by this section include the Kure Beach Board of Adjustment and the Kure Beach Planning and Zoning Commission.

This policy is applicable with the following exceptions:

#### Membership

- 1. Neither the Board of Adjustment nor the Planning and Zoning Commission shall be required to prepare and submit to Town Council a list of minimum requirements for membership.
- 2. Members shall hold no other public office under the town government and shall be appointed by the Town Council.

#### Terms and Vacancies

- Board of Adjustment members shall serve a three-year term.
   Successors shall be appointed for three-year terms to fill the expiring term (not staggered).
- Planning and Zoning Commission members shall serve a five-year term. Vacancies occurring for any reason other than for expiration of term shall be filled as they occur for the period of the unexpired term (staggered).

At the August 2018 meeting, Council directed the Administration Department staff to submit a grant application to CAMA to replace the non-ADA crossover at beach access number 1004 1/5 located at Oceanview Avenue.

Current status is the CAMA permit was approved January 2, 2019. Permit allows construction of a 240 foot long, straight line, structural ADA compliant beach access, eight feet in width (maximum) with two viewing areas on each side extending 5'3" x 8' on the north side and 5'3" x 8' on the south side as depicted in submitted drawings.

Using a straight line access instead of a zig-zag access way minimizes impact to the dune line and provides more protection for adjacent ocean front property owners.

Engineering Services (Brian Cox) is working on construction drawings and the Administration Department staff will have a grant application ready to be submitted in April 2019, which is the CAMA grant time period for applications.

CAMA has a two part grant application process. The first submittal is a 'pre-application' which CAMA reviews and if you pass this step, you are invited to submit a full application, which essentially means the grant will be approved. Grant funds are not awarded until September of each year. Admin staff will come to Council for approval at each of the above referenced steps as part of the grant application process.

Proposed amendments will: (1) provide a definition for "Monument Sign" in that Chapter 19 regulates such signs; (2) provide definitions for "Habilitation/Rehabilitation Facility" and "Homeless Shelter" and prohibit those uses; (iii) broaden the scope of the current definition for "church" by replacing it with a definition for "Religious Institution"; (iv) distinguish a secondary building used by a religious institution from a typical accessory building by defining such a structure as a "Religious Annex"; and (v) provide, as a permitted use within applicable districts, that a religious institution may use a religious

annex to house, on a temporary basis, visiting religious groups and emergency relief workers providing services during states of emergencies.

P&Z Chairman Galbraith stated the first item was brought to Council a few months ago. Council had added an allowance for monument signs but realized we didn't have a definition of a monument sign. The second item was brought to council when a local church came to Planning & Zoning requesting a special permit to allow youth groups to stay in what was defined as an accessory building. To resolve the issue we came up with what is before the council right now. To define it as a religious annex which is a larger annex to a church building and will allow these type of activities to stay there. This is not for profit and not to exceed 30 days.
