NOT ACCEPTABLES - Will not take paint, ammunition, asbestos, industrial materials, appliances, sharps, furniture, medications propane gas cylinders, trash tires or commercial/business waste. New permanent drop off will be located at NHC Dept of Environmental Management, 3002 Hwy 421 N.Wilmington, NC. Will open mid-April Will be open - 6 days a week, 4 hours a day WILL take above ACCEPTABLES plus • WILL take paint (using the latex to create a • posi-shell which covers the landfill like a thin layer of cement. Lead based used as fuel.) WILL take sharps CANNOT take pills - check with pharmacists OR NHRMC (police dept might do again) WILL take cooking oil, mobile and motor oil Joe Suleyman new director. Landfill as is will fill in about 5 years. Permit to extend the southern property will add another 45 to 50 years.

John Gordon addressing ammunitions.	JG advises to call KB police. In doubt go see gun dealer to get rid of or police dept. using the non-emergency 458- 7586. Tammy Earnhart will set up appt to bring in material or have officer come to see. They turn it into NHC gun range to use or dispose of. Munitions – during 4 years of civil war 40,000 shells + gun battles with blockade runners took place on or near our island. Most are fragments but could be a complete shell. If it looks real or like it could be still live, call 911. Anti-aircraft battery by Ft. Fisher training buried munitions by Ft Fisher. If hand grenades are found in Grandpa's footlocker or dug out of yard, don't assume they are not harmful. Call 911. They may call bomb squad.
