### BONNER STILLER RESOLUTION

Council approved Resolution R09-13 recognizing Sheriff Sid Causey for his service to the residents of New Hanover County.

### CAPE FEAR ARCH CONSERVATION COLLABORATION

On Wednesday, July 22, 2009 the Clerk gathered consensus from Council to submit the application to join this collaboration at no cost to the Town.

### CONSENT AGENDA ITEMS

Council accepted the appointment of Charlotte Philemon to the Community Center Committee.

### ECONOMIC DEVELOPMENT STUDY COMMITTEE UPDATE

The NC State School of Design is in the process of putting together a design that the committee will review. The committee will then give feedback and suggestions back to the school for design completion.

<u>GUIDELINES FOR CONTRIBUTIONS TO A NON-PROFIT ORGANIZATION</u> Council approved the proposed outside agency (non-profit) application.

### PLANNING & ZONING RECOMMENDATIONS

Council approved the new ordinance with the following amendments:

- ➤ Chapter 12 PARKS AND RECREATION, ARTICLE II. RECREATION, DIVISION 2. BEACH, Sec. 12-45. Temporary Structures.
  - ~ After the second paragraph add the following wording: Tent companies must procure a privilege license and provide proof of liability insurance.
  - ~ Add the following wording to the first sentence in the third paragraph to read: If tent is erected upon oceanfront dune, restoration of dune vegetation and sand must be performed *to the state it was prior to the tent erection*.

### ORDINANCE AMENDMENTS/ADDITIONS

Council approved the following ordinances:

- ★ Chapter 3 ALCOHOLIC BEVERAGES, Sec. 3-1. Drinking malt beverages and unfortified wine on public streets.
  - ~ Reference General Statute 18B-300 in the ordinance.
- Chapter 12 PARKS AND RECREATION, ARTICLE II. RECREATION, DIVISION 2. BEACH, Sec. 12-35. Litter, dogs, glass and alcoholic beverages prohibited on beach.
  - ~ Remove the word "dogs" from the title of this section
  - ~ Remove line (b) It shall be unlawful for any owner or keeper of a dog to permit it to be on the beach strand.
- Chapter 12 PARKS AND RECREATION, ARTICLE II. RECREATION, DIVISION 2. BEACH, Sec. 12-39. Disregarding public access to and from beach; penalty.
  - ~ Raise penalty from \$25.00 to \$100.00.

- ➤ Chapter 12 PARKS AND RECREATION, ARTICLE II. RECREATION, DIVISION 2. BEACH, Sec. 12-46. Restoration of Beach.
  - ~ This ordinance was incorrectly numbered in the packets as Sec. 12-42.
  - Council approved this new ordinance with the amendment of raising the penalty from \$50.00 to \$100.00.

## COMMITTEE MISSION STATEMENTS

Council approved mission statements for the following committees: Beach Protection, Beautification, Community Center, Economic Development, Hall of Fame, Marketing, Ocean Front Park, Parks and Recreation, SLAP, Stormwater and Street Festival.

# PURCHASE ORDER SYSTEM FOR COMMITTEES

Council approved the implementation of a purchase order system for committees, except the Community Center, for any purchase made.

# OCEAN FRONT PARK

Mayor Pro Tem Dugan is to explore solar/wind energy sources for the Town and/or Ocean Front Park with the information provided from the Energy Summit attended by the Town Administrator, and return to Council in August with recommendations.

# PARKING ISSUES AT OCEAN FRONT PARK

The SLAP committee will participate in the August 3, 2009 Economic Development Study Committee meeting. Mayor Montgomery directed Tony Gonsalves to contact Bill McDow, WMPO Parking Study Engineer, to attend the meeting with him.

## TREE CITY

Council approved beginning exploratory work towards becoming a tree city between staff and the Beautification Committee.

## CITIZEN REQUESTS

Council agreed by consensus that Town records considered "public" should be produced for public inspection at the earliest possible convenience; however, that does not mean that staff is expected to tailor an existing document to meet the needs of one particular citizen.

### NC AQUARIUM AT FORT FISHER TRICK OR TREAT UNDER THE SEA CONTRIBUTION Council approved a contribution of \$150.00.

## CUSTOMER RELATIONS

Mayor Pro Tem Dugan is to work with Attorney Canoutas to develop rules and procedures for confrontation with staff/public and staff/Council.
