The Kure Beach Town Council held its regular meeting on Monday, September 15, 2025 @ 6:00 p.m. Town Attorney Jim Eldridge was present, and there was a quorum of Council members present.

Mayor Oliver called the meeting to order at 6:00 p.m., and Commissioner Ellen gave the invocation followed by the Pledge of Allegiance.

Mayor Oliver stated the committee had to reschedule its regular meeting and expects to fill all regular membership positions soon.

3. Marketing Committee

Marketing Advisory Committee Chair Mark Dirks stated that he met with the Wilmington and Beaches Convention and Visitors Bureau (CVB), and they are excited about the Mountains to Coast Ride coming through this area. He commented that a lot of bikes and cars will be here as part of the event, so he hopes the Town will market that. Chair Dirks mentioned that the committee discussed with the CVB the potential for local tourism funds to support small-scale community events. He stated that a lot of work has been pulled back into the CVB instead of outsourcing it to third-party agencies. Chair Dirks commented that room occupancy tax (ROT) revenue for the current year is up 7.44% compared to last year and added that the committee is enthusiastic about the CVB's work. He stated that he and Commissioner Mearkle are attending a CVB meeting tomorrow.

Mayor Oliver stated that in Tourism Development Authority (TDA) meetings, they are seeing a different level of information being shared. He added that he will be at the CVB meeting in the morning.

Commissioner Mearkle commented that the Mountains to Coast Ride is important, and she asked Bike/Ped Committee Chair Linquist to reach out to Carolina Beach Town Council Member Mike Hoffer, who is the liaison for the Carolina Beach Bike/Ped Committee, so they can coordinate efforts.

Mayor Oliver noted that people will spend the weekend here after the Mountains to Coast Ride, and the Fort Fisher museum has offered to let participants camp on site. He commented that it will be good for the community and has never ended all the way down in Kure Beach before.

Commissioner Ellen shared that the Mountains to Coast Ride starts at Lake Lure and will cover 466 miles, 75 of them on the last day.

4. Planning & Zoning Commission

Planning & Zoning Commission Chairman Byron Ashbridge gave additional information about the proposed legislative hearing on tonight's agenda. He stated that this is for a freestanding pergola and is essentially just adding one more tolerance. Chairman Ashbridge reported that the Commission found no adverse effects, provided that the structures are open-air, detached from the primary structure, and still maintain a 5-foot setback. He stated that the Commission recommends approval, and the intent is to schedule the legislative hearing prior to Council's next regular meeting.

Chairman Ashbridge also reported that the Commission is reviewing Chapter 12 Planning and Development Regulations and will finish this at its October meeting, and then a text amendment will be ready to present to Council. He added that this does not require a legislative hearing.

5. Shoreline Access and Beach Protection

Commissioner Panicali stated that the committee produced new "Be a Beach Pro" magnets highlighting beach rules and etiquette as well as "Welcome to Kure Beach" brochures, both of which are available in the lobby at Town Hall and will be distributed to rental agencies and homeowners associations.

Commissioner Mearkle asked about the status of the trash can program. Staff and Council reported that there have not been any complaints since it started.

Commissioner Panicali stated that the committee put out containers so people can donate beach toys and there has been some garbage in those, but the committee has put up more signage. He added that during beach cleanups, there have been complaints that there is nothing to pick up.

6. Stormwater Committee

Stormwater Committee Chair Tracy Mitchell stated that there are no new developments to report, as they are waiting for state guidance and expect there to be some changes once this happens.

DISCUSSION AND CONSIDERATION OF DEPARTMENT HEAD BUSINESS

1. Administration

Director of Administration Sanders stated that a certified Americans with Disabilities Act (ADA) inspector stopped by Town Hall on an unofficial visit while he was in the area to thank the Town for being in compliance. She praised Recreation Director Keely.

2. Police Department

Police Chief Bailey said the department just swore in a new officer and is now fully staffed

3. Public Works Department

Public Works Director Jimmy Mesimer was not present, but MPT Heglar reported that the department worked on a few sewer blockages on the south end of Town over the weekend. He commented that overall, everything is going well.

DISCUSSION AND CONSIDERATION OF OLD BUSINESS

 Continued Discussion of Proposed Text Amendment to KBC 11.20.010 Oceanfront Deck Encroachment

Director of Development and Compliance White stated that a new ordinance was drafted based on two changes Council requested at the last meeting.

MPT Heglar commented that Public Works is fine with what the Compliance Department recommends. He asked if the Coastal Area Management Act (CAMA) and U.S. Army Corps of Engineers agree with the verbiage. Director of Development and Compliance White said yes, the verbiage is more restrictive than what the agencies require.

MPT Heglar stated that this came from the Planning & Zoning Commission and asked if it satisfies what was being asked. Planning & Zoning Commission Chairman Ashbridge commented that this was a personal item and an inquiry into what could be done, with no specific intent. He added that he thinks this is a fair compromise.

2. Resolution R25-08 for the Kure Beach Town Council to Request Additional Funds for the Fort Fisher and K Avenue Intersection Project and to Provide the Required Local Match

Mayor Oliver stated that the Letter to WMPO_2025-09-05 document hereby incorporated into the minutes spells out the need for this. He commented that the right-of-way cost was originally projected at \$20,000, so they really missed the mark on that. Mayor Oliver added that Council explored the possibility of some property owners donating toward this project, but they were not interested in this. Mayor Oliver stated that the Wilmington Urban Area Metropolitan Planning Organization (WMPO) has a program that will fund 80% of the project, with the other 20% coming from the Town, adding that the only downside is that the work will not occur until a year from now. He commented that he thinks it will be well worth the wait.

Commissioner Panicali asked if the right-of-way cost could go up again. Mayor Oliver stated that he doesn't think so because the appraisal and agreement should be good for a period of time and the construction cost is recent, so he feels good about that. He added that even though it's not a big project, the complexities are amazing. Mayor Oliver also read the resolution.

Mountains to the Coast - October 11

On Saturday, October 11, from 10 a.m.–3 p.m., the 7-day *Mountains to the Coast* bicycle ride will culminate in Ft. Fisher, bringing an estimated 1,000–1,500 cyclists through Kure Beach. A "Welcome to Kure Beach" banner will be displayed as riders enter town. The Bike Ped Committee has agreed to "adopt" the final rest stop at River Road Park and is recruiting volunteers to assist there. Additional volunteers are needed to cheer along the route—particularly at the bend of Dow and K and continuing to Ft. Fisher's Battle Acre Park. Supporters are encouraged to bring bells, whistles, pots, and wooden spoons to create excitement; cowbells will be provided to distribute along the route.
