

PUBLIC MEETING NOTICE

Military Ocean Terminal Sunny Point Joint Land Use Study

On Monday June 24th and Tuesday June 25th, the Cape Fear Council of Governments (CFCOG) will hold public meetings in Kure Beach and Southport, respectively, to present the draft Military Ocean Terminal Sunny Point (MOTSU) Joint Land Use Study (JLUS) on behalf of the study partners, which include CFCOG, MOTSU, Brunswick County, New Hanover County, and the municipalities of Boiling Spring Lakes, Carolina Beach, Kure Beach, Leland, and Southport. This third series of public meetings will focus on the study's recommendations and implementation plans. Members of the consulting team that prepared the study and representatives from MOTSU will be available to answer questions and take comments at the meeting. The public is invited to attend one of the meetings at the times and locations provided below.

The primary purpose of the JLUS is to identify potential land use conflicts around the installation and the Army's railroad corridor from MOTSU to Leland that might impede the long-term sustainability of MOTSU's operational mission. The draft JLUS contains over 50 recommendations for MOTSU and the local government partners to consider implementing to mitigate the identified land use conflicts, improve coordination between the installation and local governments, and work collaboratively toward addressing issues related to public safety, transportation and community infrastructure needs.
